DIOCESE BUILDING FUND

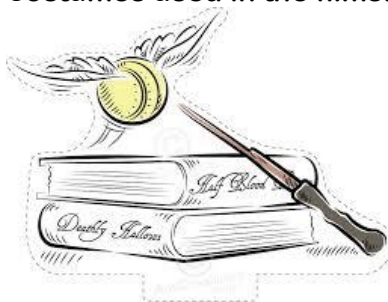
