Please find below a list of activities that we would like you to complete this week. Please do not try to do all of these activities in one day; spread them out over the week so that you are doing some school related work throughout each day as if you were in school. Try to work between the hours of 9am and 3pm.

To be done over 2 weeks: Holy Week booklet

Using Matthew's Gospel we would like the children to create an information booklet all about Holy Week. This should include: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. You can include the other days and their events too. The booklet can include images, quotes from the Bible and writing about what happened on each day. We would like you to include how Catholics remember these days e.g. Palms on Palm Sunday.

Science – We are looking at the topic of Animals including humans. Please learn about the 5 food groups - **bread, cereals and potatoes (carbohydrates), meat and fish, fruit and vegetables, milk and dairy, and fats and sugars**. Identify some food which belong to each of these groups. Create a healthy plate. You can do this by drawing on paper, making a real plate of healthy food and take a picture, or draw the sections onto an actual paper plate.

Topic - WE DO NOT EXPECT THIS TO BE DONE THIS WEEK – PLEASE TAKE YOUR TIME ON THIS PROJECT.

In year 3, we have enjoyed learning about Africa. We have just started learning more specifically about Ancient Egypt. In light of this, we would like you to do your own project on Ancient Egypt. You could use a ring binder and include information on areas such as:

- . The Geography of Ancient Egypt (where it is, what is the climate like, what countries are nearby, any special features e.g. rivers, desert, red land, black land).
- . Who the Ancient Egyptians were
- . The role of the River Nile
- . King Tutankhamun (the boy king)
- . Howard Carter
- . The Valley of the Kings
- . Ramses II and his wife Queen Nefertari
- . Egyptian gods and goddesses
- . Egyptian fashion
- . Pyramids
- . Egyptian art and hieroglyphics
- . The importance of cats in Ancient Egypt

- . Mummification!
- . Canopic jars
- . Egyptian numbers
- . The Exodus (the journey) – when Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt
- . Animals in Ancient Egypt
- . Egyptian fashion

Here are some things you might like to do in your project: writing, drawing pictures and diagrams, make models, create your own mummies, make your own Tutankhamun mask, build a pyramid out of lego or using a net, make some Egyptian jewellery, make a scarab beetle, write your name in hieroglyphics, write a diary entry as Howard Carter discovering the tomb of Tutankhamun, retell the story of the Exodus, and more!

You might include a contents page, a glossary (like a dictionary for key words), a front cover, chapters, etc.

We can't wait to share your projects and hope you have lots of fun doing this!
