

Year 2 Home Learning week beginning 11th May 2020

Please find below a list of activities that we would like you to complete this week. Please do not try to do all of these activities in one day; spread them out over the week so that you are doing some school related work throughout each day as if you were in school. Try to work between the hours of 9am and 3pm.

Continue to use class Dojo our online platform which allows us to communicate with you. We will aim to check for messages each day

English – This week's English focus is looking at refreshing your phonics knowledge and applying it when using sentences with unfamiliar words.

You will be first directed to play a simple sounds game. Once you click the yellow start button move forward until you find the Sally and Percy section. Once there find the simple sounds game and have a go.

This will help you familiarise yourself with the simple sounds to then complete the three activities that follow.

The last activity requires you to write sentences, please remember to use your full stops, capital letters and any other correct punctuation.

At the end there is a link to direct you to play the Karate Cats game and also links to recap your phase 3 phonics.

Spellings – improve, sure, sugar, eye, could, should, would, who

Reading – I hope you are still enjoying the books online from Oxford Owl. We have also managed to find more online books that link to our reading bands. Go to <https://connect.collins.co.uk/school/Portal.aspx> and then you need to click on the teacher portal. The access codes are below:

Maths – For maths this week we would like you to work on the part whole relationship and fact families (4th May activity). Then we would then like you to work on number facts (6th May activity). You can access both of these following this link.



ART




We are all getting slightly bored with lockdown and having to see the same view, same possessions and same faces every day in our own homes.

Science/topic – For our topic work this week we would like you to discover the trees that grow in your area. This might be in your garden or when you are out in your local park or woodland area. We have attached a guide to the 24 most common British tree species you are likely to encounter in urban and suburban areas. Covering species like Oak, Sycamore, Beech and Ash as well as other commonly planted suburban species like Lime, Rowan and Sweet Chestnut. How many can you find in your local area? You could collect some while you are out (with your parents' permission) and make a poster/diagram of all the ones you are able to find when you get back. We are also going to have a go and will share the ones we find on the class Dojo. You can either open the guide on your parents phone/iPad or print off the sheet if you have a printer.
