
Please continue to use Class Dojo to keep in touch. We will be checking this daily to see what you're up to and be available if you have any questions or need help.

This half term our science topic is States of Matter.

Water is a liquid that can change state easily and quickly. When water is frozen it becomes a solid - ice and when it is heated it becomes a gas - water vapour.


This week we would like you to do an investigation! You will investigate how long it takes for chocolate to melt in different water temperatures. You need three varying temperatures but all above room temperature. The water can be put into foil trays or bowls. **Please do this with an adult as you will be using hot water.**

Use this frame to plan your investigation.

I will make sure each piece of chocolate is the same/a different size. I will use the same/different amounts of water in each tray. The temperatures of the water in each tray should be the same/different.

Art/D&T/Creativity

This week we would like you to have a go at making some Greek food – one of our favourites – Tzatziki!

Here is a very simple recipe to follow – there may be other dishes you would like to try too but this is just one that we thought would be simple and fun for you to make. Send us photos of your creations on Dojo to inspire others to have a go too!

Ingredients

350g/12oz Greek-style **yoghurt**

1 **cucumber**

2 tbsp **lemon juice** (or white wine vinegar)

2 **garlic** cloves, grated finely

dash of extra virgin **olive oil**

paprika, for sprinkling

Method

1. The best result is achieved by peeling and de-seeding the cucumber before grating. Hang the grated cucumber in muslin cloth or a tea towel in order to squeeze out all the excess liquid, if you like. Or you can simply grate the cucumber into a sieve and leave overnight to get rid of the excess liquid.
2. Combine the yoghurt, cucumber, lemon juice and garlic. Add a dash of olive oil and sprinkle with paprika.
