We would like you to build an **Easter garden** to show what you have learnt about the story of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Add as much detail as you can think to include. Everyone will have a varied amount of resources available so be creative.

We understand that some of you may not have access to a garden so possibly use your daily walk outside to a park to do this task. Please be mindful of the social distancing and protecting the parks wildlife in the process of creating your garden. It may mean that you do not bring the garden you made home, so take lots of photos.

Writing – A few of you have been keeping a diary over the lockdown period, which is a great way of remembering this particular part of history we are experiencing.

In your literacy task this week you will **understand how to write a diary entry, remember when to use question marks** and learn that **questions can start with many different words.**

Using this link <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z7b72sg> you will watch some video clips to remind you about using punctuation and you will also hear a little bit about the story the 'Magic Faraway Tree' by Enid Blyton and its characters.

(My particular favourite character is Mr What's his name, who has a big round face like the moon, and can't remember his own name!)

You are then asked to write a short diary entry based on the knowledge you have learnt.

For practise on your punctuation follow this link for a small town superhero's game. Choose to work on your punctuation when given the prompt and then throughout the week choose to play on a different punctuation each day there are a few to choose from including capital letters, full stops, commas, exclamation marks, questions marks or even a random selection.

Maths –This week's maths focus will be money. BBC bitesize are offering daily lessons on this so please log on to <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/dailylessons> each day for the learning. Once you have clicked on the daily lessons page you then need to select the correct year group and each day follow the maths learning page. This will not be available until Monday so you won't have access to this over the weekend. There are helpful videos and PowerPoints for your children to watch. There are lessons each day but please only do what you can as we know this is a lot of work. We have also set some maths on MyMaths as we know children are used to using this and enjoy it.

It works like this:

Monday – Recognising coins and amounts

Tuesday – Make amounts

Wednesday – compare and order amounts

Thursday – solve problems involving money

Friday – Challenge of the week

These will be available over the week so you can spread the workload out over the week. An alternative to the online lessons would be to get the children to do some chores around the house for money. They can try and recognise the coins you give them and count up the coins to find how much they've earned.

PHSE /ART – Lay the table in the shape of a tree task.

The famous artist Paul Klee thought that trees represented the 'life force'.



Using this artist's example can you make your own tree out of utensils you may find around the house. You could use spoons, cookie cutters, spatulas anything goes!




Once complete either draw your piece or photograph it and every time you look at this image you will see an image of the 'life force'.

PE – Continue with your daily exercise and throwing and catching skills in the garden or when out. If you want a ten minute break between learning you can access some fun, short exercise videos on YouTube by searching Go Noodle. This is the link to one

Topic – This week we would like you to find a rock when you are out for your daily exercise and decorate it with a positive message. You can then leave this rock in your local park or woodland for another child to find. You can use felt tips, sharpies or paint on the rock. Don't forget to ask your parents before you pick anything up and ideally pick up the rock using a tissue/bag and wash it thoroughly with soap when you get home. Always wash your hands with soap straight away when you get home. We have included some ideas.
