Dear Parents

Supporting your child to be independent – I have come across a useful document for parents to help support their children to become more independent. Good afternoon,

We are the tenants at Monica's parish centre flat. Most days around 9am and 3pm school drop off time "some parents" are blocking our driveway. Yesterday, early in the morning around 8.15am the driveway was completely blocked and we couldn't use our car. Instead left with no choice we had to walk our 4 year old twins to their nursery. It's a long 20 min walk especially when you try to be there on time. It's an ongoing issue (9 years) but this is this first time I am bringing it to your attention. I hope, with your help, some parents will get the message that "We need access to our flat at all times" especially now with our twins.
