Autumn Term 2

★ Dear Parents/Carers,

★ Welcome back to another half term. Here is some information about what your children will be learning over the next few weeks:

★ RE

★ Our topic is called 'From Advent to Christmas' and we will be learning about:

- ★ 1. Advent - why is it so important and how long does it last?
- ★ 2. Some key Bible stories: The Annunciation, Mary's visit to Elizabeth and The Birth of Jesus (according to the Gospel of Luke)
- ★ 3. Christmas celebrations today

★ Key vocabulary: *Advent, Christmas (the Mass of Christ), Messiah, Incarnation, saviour, Luke, Gospel, author, audience, community, midrash*

★ English

★ We will be finishing off our book *Ug* and then our focus book will be 'Tom's Sausage Lion' by Michael Morpurgo. The children will be exploring significant themes of bullying, trust, friendship and self-belief through role-play, debate, poetry composition and other forms of writing. We incorporate spellings into our Literacy lessons and the children will be sent home word lists for homework.

★ We ask that you try to read with your child for at least 10 minutes each day at home using a range of different texts. Please focus on their *understanding* of the text and identify any words that they may not know the meaning of. Building their vocabulary and understanding the text are both essential skills in becoming strong readers.

Maths

We will be:

- learning how to use the column method for addition and subtraction. E.g.

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- recalling and using multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.

History - 'Cradles of Civilisation'

The children will find out about 'early humans' who lived in Mesopotamia (the Sumerians) and how they lived. We will be exploring the similarities and differences between the Sumerians and other early civilisations.

Geography - 'Mountains'

We will be learning to tell the difference between a hill and a mountain. We will also be looking at maps and exploring different mountain ranges (e.g. the Himalayas, Tien Shien, the Alps and the Andes). The children will be learning about people who live on mountains, as well as looking at different mountainous regions of the UK.

D&T

Closer to Christmas, we will be learning how to sew as part of our D&T topic 'Christmas'; each of the children will be making a small Christmas stocking.



★ ICT

★ **We are bug fixers**

★ In this unit, pupils learn to recognise some common types of programming error, and practise solving problems through logical thinking.

★ **E-Safety**

★ We will look at how to keep safe from the risks the children may encounter online. We will also be learning about how to act respectfully and responsibly when using digital technologies.

★ Science

★ We will be continuing with our 'rocks' topic before moving onto 'Light'. The children will be exploring different sources of lights. They will learn what the words 'transparent', 'translucent' and 'opaque' mean. We will be finding out what makes a good reflector of light and the children will be learning how to protect their eyes from the sun.

★ PE

★ Invasion games: In this unit the children develop skills in finding and using space to keep the ball. They also begin to learn how to outwit their opponents when playing invasion games.

★ Dance: The children will explore basic body actions, e.g. jumping, shapes and travel, and use different parts of their body to make movements. They will create and repeat short dances inspired by themes. The children will think how to use movement to communicate ideas, moods and feelings.
