Mrs Roper also explained to the Infant children that sometimes we need resources to help us with our learning and she shared what some of those things are. We appreciate how we are all different and have our own unique successes and challenges and we must be respectful of each other and support one another.

On Monday I spoke to all the children about October being the month of the Holy Rosary. Before school, Years 5 & 6 have prayed a decade of the Rosary at the front of the school. On Monday we invite Year 4, Tuesday – Year 3, Wednesday – Year 2, Thursday – Year 1 and Friday – Reception.
