On Monday all the staff had some very useful training about effective speech and communication. The importance of listening while someone is talking can never be overestimated – we have two ears and one mouth for a reason! All the staff learnt useful strategies to support children with their learning.

You may have seen the news this week raising concerns about children's attendance at school. I am very pleased that ours has returned to pre-Covid levels. Today we are at 96.84%, which I hope we can sustain – as every day in class counts!

<u>Assemblies</u> – At Tuesday's assembly, I spoke to all the children about the Gospel reading from Sunday which had been a parable which taught us about the generosity of God. I was also delighted to announce our new Year 6 monitors. The Year 6 children had written fantastic letters of application and then went through an interview process with me. Various monitoring roles they have been offered are: chairs & benches for assemblies, recycling, library, pond, wet-play, infant play leader, music, cloakroom & PE cupboard. Congratulations to all those children who showed initiative, relevant skills and confidence through this process.

On Wednesday at Junior assembly, Mr Rose celebrated European languages day. The children explored and discussed the value of learning languages and even learnt some new phrases. Some children showcased their linguistic diversity by staring in a short film celebrating languages in our school. Furthermore, they discussed the importance of body language and that brail and sign language were rightly promoted alongside traditional languages.
