How to help at home

Continue to encourage your child to read at home, both books from school and books, magazines, and news of their choice. Engage your child in conversation about what they are reading and their thoughts on the text. One of the things we do in Year 6 is to ask the children to use point, evidence, explanation verbally to ensure they can evidence their points and then explain them clearly and coherently.

In RF this half term...

In French this half term, we will be looking at the topic "At the weekend


In Maths...

An example of calculating volume:

Scott uses the formula to work out the area of this right-angled triangle.



area =
$$\frac{1}{2}$$
 × base × perpendicular height
area = $\frac{1}{2}$ × 6 × 4 = $\frac{1}{2}$ × 24 = 12 cm²

In Geography...

The children will be learning about the geological features of both North and South America; Comparing the two continents and learning about the vibrant cultures in each.

In ICT...

The children will be developing their skills to use social media safely in our 'We are connected' topic. They will consider the reliability of online sources, show respect when responding to other people's views online and discuss online bullying and how they should respond to it.
