<u>Parents' Evening</u> – Thank you for providing your views about parents' evening. The overwhelming majority of parents said that they would prefer a face to face meeting and so therefore I arranged with the teachers that they would be available on Tues 27th until 5.30pm and Wed 28th until 7.30pm. I recognise that a small number of parents would still prefer an online meeting and if that is the case, please email the office and the class teacher will contact you to make a time separately.

<u>Assemblies</u> – Mrs Roper spoke to all the children on Monday about Lent. Lent is a time in the Christian Church's year when we reflect on how we can become more like Jesus, through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Fasting can be food related or giving up something that takes up a lot of your time, time that could be better spent elsewhere (such as gaming/going online/playing with your phone when you could be talking with your family or helping with chores!) We will focus this Lent on two charities, one closer to home which is the St Monica's food bank (Mrs Tottle-Nugent has written separately about this) and the second will be related to an orphanage in the Democratic Republic of Congo – the children will hear all about this next week.

On Tuesday morning Miss Dalton read "No Matter What" by Debi Gliori to Year 2 and 1G. We talked about how the character 'Large' loved 'Small' no matter what and discussed how this is similar to God's love. It doesn't bend, break or stop - God loves us no matter what.
