<u>Girls Night</u> – Thanks to everyone for their support with the Girls' Night last Friday, it was a such a lovely atmosphere and **£1190** was raised in profit which is excellent – thank you to The Friends!

<u>Assemblies</u> - We have had some inspirational assemblies this week! I started the week speaking to the children about the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the United Nations (UN). This was in preparation for Laith's mum Bee (from Yr2) who works for the UN, who came on Tuesday with two of her colleagues to talk about a special project in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). During Lent we are aiming to focus on SDG 1 "no poverty", SDG 4 "quality education" and SDG 5 "gender equality" by raising money for an orphanage in the town of Bukavu in the DRC. We are aiming to hold an event where the children will be sponsored to achieve something – more details to follow. Bee will be visiting the orphanage in May and will return to school with photos to show how the money has been spent. It's a very exciting project which I hope you will be able to support. On Wednesday we had an extremely informative assembly from Ruth who works for "Judaism for schools". She stayed in school for two days to lead workshops for all the children, which were excellent and thoroughly enjoyable. The children have learnt a lot about Judaism this week. Thanks very much to Miss Nolan for organising this for the whole school!



On Thursday, we were all entertained by Class 6G's assembly. They took us to a book Oscars and wowed us with their wide range of reading and technological skills to show case their acting! Very well done to our authors and cinematographers of the future!
