

It's budget setting time and I have attended two workshops this week about effective management of finances. Unfortunately, we are expected to do more with less funds. If you visit

Thanks to **The Friends** who continue to work so hard to support the school financially. I heard the St Patrick's Night event was a huge success and raised £2,000!! Incredible!

Thanks also to all those parents who have contributed to the School Building Fund. Thanks to your contributions we have been able to upgrade all the school's electric fuse boards which meets health and safety regulations. In addition, we will be getting air-conditioning installed to the main hall, Class 1G, Class 5Y and Class 6G ready for the summer. The past few years have been uncomfortably hot and made learning very challenging, so I hope these units will make a huge difference. If you have not contributed, it's a voluntary request for £45 per family each year. As a voluntary aided school, we do not receive a capital grant in the way maintained schools do and so this fund is essential to keep our buildings maintained.
