Dear Parents

This year seems to be flying by, it's May already! In the Catholic tradition, May is a month when we particularly honour Mary, Jesus' mother. During this month, we pray a decade of the Rosary every morning outside the front of school at 8.50am. Everyone is welcome to join in with this devotion.

<u>Assemblies</u> — On Monday I spoke to the children about Islam as the children have been learning about this religion in their RE lessons this week. You can watch the video I showed here. On Tuesday, Mrs Weston read 'The Most Exciting Eid' by Zeba Talkhani. She talked about all the special traditions that Muslims take part in to celebrate Eid & Ramadan & we discussed how they were similar to Christian traditions for Easter & Christmas.

May is the month of Our Lady – On Thursday we held our traditional May procession, led by Fr David. Thank you very much to one of our mums, Mrs Harwicke who made a beautiful crown of flowers for the Our Lady statue. It was a special service with fantastic singing and appropriate reverence. Thanks also to the many flowers which were brought in; Fr David blessed them and today two of our mums (who are sisters), Mrs Verani and Mrs Gregori (and their dad) planted them at the front of the school (in the rain!!) They did a wonderful job and the front of the school looks very attractive. Thank you very much!

Another tradition is giving the children in Reception a miraculous medal which they can wear during May. I wonder how many other children in other years can find theirs?



Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL) — At St Monica's, we are part of a peer review process where leaders from other local schools visit one another to evaluate the work they are doing. On Wednesday this week, we had a visit from a local headteacher and two deputy headteachers to review the impact on OPAL for the children and their general behaviour. They found that the lunch time play was a highly stimulating, engaging and enjoyable period for the children and staff alike. They praised the OPAL staff team for their enthusiastic approach to this initiative and judged behaviour to be outstanding! I was proud to show off our school to these visitors.
